Functional Hindi as an elective subject at the undergraduate level aims at exposure of the younger generation to the nature, uses and terminology of the language. Hindi, besides being the national language is also the official language of the Centre Govt. offices and offices of certain states of North India. The main objective of the course is to improve the communication skills of the students.

Students should have studied Hindi as one of the subjects at the +2 level. There are only 30 seats in Functional Hindi. Admission will be strictly on merit.

B.Sc.I- Microbiology (Elective)

ACADEMIC NEED OF THE COURSE

Microbiology, dealing with the study of micro-organisms, until recently had been a neglected branch of biology but at present it has revolutionized the field of biology throughout the world. Microorganisms have proved to be more important to mankind than was ever imagined. The scope of microbial processes has increased tremendously during the last 20 years. The scope covers industry, medicine, agriculture, environment, biotechnology, forestry, pharmacy-fields that are vital to the economy of any country. The microbial processes are playing a very important role in enhancing employment opportunities, trade,

economics and quality of human life. Keeping in view the potential to generate various specialized jobs, the college proposes to start Microbiology as an elective subject at B.Sc. level. This course will be very helpful in food and dairy industry, pharmaceutical industry, organic chemicals industry, research avenues in agricultural microbiology, medicinal microbiology, environmental microbiology and bioremediation. **No. of seats in this course is 30.**

Eligibility: Applicants seeking admission to this course should have passed class XII (Medical Group) examination of CBSE/PSEB or any other equivalent examination recognized by the Punjab University. The candidate should have obtained at least 40% marks in aggregate at this level. However, admission will be on the basis of merit as per general rules of admission.

Note:

1. Subjects filled by the students at the time of admission are provisional.
2. Change of subject will be allowed only once as per the availability of seats in the subject to be taken up.

3. With regard to Functional English, Functional Hindi, Science, Commerce and other subjects with practicals, the students cannot appear privately. They must ensure that they have 75% attendance in theory as well as practicals and are also academically eligible based on the marks obtained in the house test.
4. A student cannot opt for more than two subjects having practicals.
5. No student shall opt for Mathematics as an elective subject unless she had taken up this subject in the previous examination.
6. Physical Education can be taken up by those students who have either studied the subject in the lower class or have participated in Inter School/College Sports Tournaments. Certificate in this regard will have to be produced at the time of interview. As per new guidelines of P.U., Chandigarh the admission of students in Physical Education shall be finalized after conducting Physical Fitness Test/Coopers-12 minutes run/walk test. The subject will not be offered to Physically challenged students. Trials for the subject will be held from 4.7.2007 to 7.7.2007 at 9.00 a.m. in the college grounds. There will be no second chance for these trials.

Post-Graduate Diploma in Translation (English to Hindi)

The college offers one year part-time diploma in Translation from English to Hindi as per rules and regulations of Punjab University. This diploma is being conducted under the aegis of Dept. of Hindi, Punjab University, Chandigarh.

CANCELLATION OF SEATS / ADMISSION

Admission of all such students who fail to attend at least 33% of the total lectures delivered and practical held in all the papers during the first 10 days from the start of teaching work in the course concerned shall be cancelled by the Principal of the College on the recommendations of H.O.D. of Physical Education / Incharge B.P.Ed course after following the procedure given below:

1. By the 12th day after the start of classes for a particular course, the names of those students who fail to attend at least 33 % of the total lectures / practicals shall be put up on the Department Notice Board. Within 4 days of the date of such notice, a student who is short of attendance may give in writing the reasons for her absence from the classes.
2. If a student does not submit an application in writing within the prescribed time as stated above, or the reasons given by the student in her application are not found to be sufficient and justified in the opinion of the office of the Principal / HOD Physical Education, her admission shall be cancelled.
3. All the seats thus falling vacant shall be filled from the waiting list or through subsequent counselling before the expiry of the last date fixed for admissions by the College / University.
4. When the admission of the students is cancelled as stated above, the

Department shall display on the Department Notice Board the list of the person (s) next in the waiting list and make admissions accordingly.

Note: It is obligatory on the part of the students to keep in touch with the Department for the possibility of the seats to fall vacant.

Eligible students should contact the college office for further information.

COLLEGE TIMINGS AND PRESENCE IN THE COLLEGE

1. The college starts at 8:00 am.
2. Students must remain in the college till 12:30 pm even if they finish their classes before that time.
3. No visitors are allowed to see the students during college working hours.
4. In case of emergency, only the lecturer authorized by the Principal will sign the application for gate leave.

COLLEGE HOSTEL

Govt. College for Girls, Sector-42, Chandigarh has a hostel that has accommodation for 260 students. It is modern in concept and design and has the latest amenities. The hostel has a common room, a T.V. room and a guest room attached to it. Facilities like geysers, water coolers with attached water purifiers, public telephone, indoor and outdoor games are available to the resident students. Hostel Superintendent and supporting staff is there to take care of the general well – being of the students. Members of Anti –Stress Committee and Hostel Welfare Committee regularly visit the hostel to look into the problems, if any, of the resident students.

HOSTEL ADMISSION

1. A candidate seeking admission to the hostel should apply for hostel seat on prescribed form (available in the hostel) along with Admission Form of the college.

2. Students seeking admission to the hostel are expected to read all the rules and regulations printed on the back of the hostel admission form and in the prospectus. Rules and regulations notified from time to time will be binding on resident students.
3. Admission to Hostel will be as per rules and regulations issued by Chandigarh Administration and will be decided by Hostel Admission Committee.
4. Allotment of rooms in the hostel will be made strictly according to the rules framed by the College.
5. Old resident students should apply afresh for admission. Their merit and their conduct in the hostel in the previous session will be taken into consideration. For old residents of the hostel, it is notified that admission to the hostel is not a matter of right.
6. Interview for hostel admission before the admission committee will be held after the college admission on the notified dates for admission in the college. Parents must accompany their ward for interview (even in the case of old students).
7. Students suffering from a serious / chronic ailment will not be admitted in the hostel. In case this fact is concealed from the authorities at the time of admission, the student's seat will be cancelled the moment it is so discovered.

8. Hostel seat is allotted strictly on merit and only for one academic year.

GENERAL RULES

1. A hostel resident is required to attend a minimum of 50% of lectures delivered per month and 75% of the total lectures delivered failing which she has to vacate her hostel room.
2. Students who fail to obtain 25% marks in aggregate in house examination or have lecture shortage will forfeit their hostel seat.
3. Possession and consuming of any kind of intoxicants in the hostel shall entail expulsion from the hostel.
4. All the residents are required to take their meals in the hostel mess. Minimum charges of 40 meals per month will be charged from each resident.
5. No resident will pass on the key of her room to another resident or to an outsider.
6. Internal locks / latch locks are not permitted to be installed in the hostel room.
7. In case a resident absents herself from classes in the college for seven days continuously without prior permission, she will be asked to vacate the hostel seat.
8. A resident whose name is struck off from the college rolls for any reason will have to vacate the hostel seat.

9. No student will be allowed to stay in the college hostel during Autumn and Winter Break and Summer Vacations (after University Examinations).
10. Hostel rooms and premises must be kept neat and tidy.
11. Roll Call –All students will report for roll call at 7:00 pm (Summers) and 5:30 pm (Winters).
12. Only parents / guardians will be allowed to meet their wards from 3: 30 pm to 5:30 pm on Saturdays and 10:30 am to 1:00 pm on Sundays.

APPOINTMENT OF LOCAL GUARDIAN

1. Appointment of a Local Guardian is a must for admission to the Hostel.
2. Male students (real brothers and cousins) will not be accepted as local guardians and will not be allowed to enter the college premises.
3. In case of an emergency, local guardians will be informed.
4. The parents are advised to check the attendance, house test results, record of outings etc of their wards regularly.

JOINING THE HOSTEL

1. Resident students are expected to arrive a day before the term starts.
2. They are expected to bring their own bedding, bed linen, locks, tumblers, steel plates, spoons, a bucket, a mug, door curtains, bulb and tube rod.

3. Furniture will be issued to the resident students against their signature. Each student will be responsible for any breakage or loss of furniture issued to her. Before leaving the hostel she must obtain a certificate from the warden that she has returned the furniture issued to her.
4. Hostel students are not permitted to use private electrical appliances. In case of a default a fine of Rs 500/- will be imposed and the electrical appliance will be confiscated. They are also warned not to tamper with electrical fittings. The college will not be responsible for any mishap.
5. The college does not take the responsibility of valuables (especially mobile phones) and of excessive cash of resident students. They are therefore advised not to bring jewellery with them.
6. The college does not take any responsibility for any action of any girl which proves fatal or is detrimental to her social position.

PERMISSION TO LEAVE THE HOSTEL

1. Students will not be allowed to leave the hostel before the teaching is officially declared off. Prior permission of the Principal has to be obtained if any reservation for train / bus has to be got done before the last day of teaching. Parents are to ensure that they comply with these rules strictly.

- If parents want to give a permanent authority to their wards to leave the hostel for tuitions, day –out or home town trip, they must fill the specified form at the time of admission to the hostel and sign the register.

OUTINGS

- Sundays from 10:00 am to 5:30 pm. Festivals and other special outings will be announced from time to time. Attendance will be taken at 5:30 pm sharp.
- Visits to the local guardian and home town will only be on the weekends.
- Official Holidays** - Students are allowed to go home on official holidays on

the production of permission letter from the parents and after submission of leave application. In case they extend the stipulated period of stay without informing the Hostel Authority within 24 hours a serious action will be taken against them.

FACILITIES AVAILABLE IN THE HOSTELS

Food – Good vegetarian food at reasonable rates is served in the hostel mess. Students are required to take their meals in the dining room. No student is permitted to take food to her room without the special permission of Warden / Nurse. Students must be punctual for meals and must come properly dressed to the dining hall.

Laundry (Dhobi) – Facility for washing and ironing of clothes is available on the premises on payment.

Telephone – STD / PCO is available within the hostel premises.

Dispensary for the Resident Students –

There is a dispensary attached to the hostel. A nurse is available on the premises to look after the resident students. In case of emergency, the girl is taken to the hospital immediately. A visiting lady doctor comes on alternate days.
